**BACK TO SCHOOL BASH**

In collaboration with Scurry County Ministerial Alliance, SCRC hosted our 1st Annual B2SB! Local businesses, organizations, churches, cosmetologists, and individuals gathered to ensure that this event was an absolute success. A total of **121 families, 421 students, and 1042 people** were served. Our very FIRST year!! It was so incredible to see the community-wide impact that was made on each family that we served. Licensed cosmetologists gave free haircuts to over 30 school-age children. Map colors, markers, paper, filled pencil bags, glue, kleenex, and so many other school supplies were handed out absolutely free of charge to each child. Families filled a bag of clothes for \$1 per bag. None of this would have been possible if our community did not come together to serve each individual and family.



**PERMIAN BASIN AREA FOUNDATION**

SCRC received a \$15,000 grant from Permian Basin Area Foundation (PBAF). PBAF awarded more than \$1.5 million in grants to 44 nonprofit organizations. SCRC funding has been used to aid families through our emergency assistant program, help individuals get to long-term treatment, prepare for the implementation of our Snyder Area Naturalization Assistance program, as well as add a part-time employee to our staff. 


## A Letter from the President

This partnership has enabled us to help individuals and families through iCare who are in need of help with TXU bills. This has allowed us to expand our emergency assistance program by freeing up funding that would have otherwise been used toward TXU utilities.



Snyder Area Naturalization Assistance program will be taking it's next step soon! Trainings have been underway and individuals will be applying for Recognition & Accreditation within the next few weeks. Once approved by our government, SCRC will be able to help low income and indigent immigrants apply for citizenship!
